Highlights will include music for the coronations of George II, Edward VII, George V, and Elizabeth II, and for the wedding of Their Royal Highnesses the Duke and Duchess of Cambridge earlier this year, including Sir Charles Hubert Hastings Parry's *I was glad* and *Blest pair of sirens*, and the New York premier of Paul Mealor's *Ubi caritas*.



Tickets for the concert will be available at the door, and are \$15 general seating, \$5 high school & college students, children under 13 admitted free.

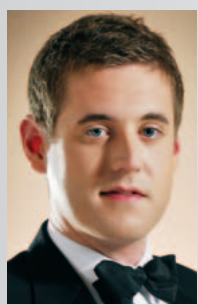

### In Concert: Accord Treble Choir

Formed in 2009 by friends and veteran choral singers in NYC, the Accord Treble Choir selects challenging music – from medieval chant to modern choral works that emphasizes the beauty of treble voices. The choir explores various languages and styles, with emphasis on 20th century Eastern European composers. Their program, titled "Melodies of Magyar: The Sounds of Hungary," will include pieces in Latin and Hungarian by Lajos Bardos, Miklos Kocsar, Orban, Bartok, Kodaly, and more!



Tickets for the concert will be available at the door, and are \$15 general seating, \$5 high school & college students, children under 13 admitted free.

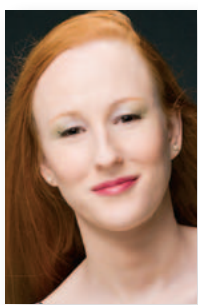


### Sunday, February 26th at 4:00 pm Recital by Brandon Dumas

A native of Albany, New York, Brandon is Associate Organist and Choirmaster of the Cathedral of the Incarnation, Garden City, New York. Most recently, Brandon's work took him to London where he has just finished his studies in Choral Conducting at The Royal Academy of Music. Prior to this, he spent a year with the Choir of Royal Holloway, University of London as co-conductor and organist of the ensemble, recording for the Hyperion Records label, broadcasting regularly on BBC Radio 3,

touring Western Europe and California, and performing in such major UK cathedrals as St. Paul's, Westminster, Gloucester, Ely, Worcester, and Salisbury.

Katherine Meloan is director of chapel music at the United States Merchant Marine Academy in King's Point Long Island where she is the director of chapel choirs and plays for all services. She has served as music director at Trinity-Saint John's Episcopal Church in Hewlett, New York, and is currently organist at Beth Shalom in Bayside, New York. Katherine is a doctoral candidate in organ performance at Manhattan School of Music, New York. She has an active interest

in teaching, and is writing her doctoral thesis on Organ Pedagogy for Beginning Organists. Katherine will be playing music of Marcel Dupré, Charles-Marie Widor, and J.S. Bach.

Ryan is a native of Bracebridge, Ontario, where he began piano study at an early age, and took up the organ at seventeen. Ryan has won three major Canadian competitions: the National Organ Playing Competition (sponsored by the Royal Canadian College of Organists), the Florence and Stanley Osborne National Organ Playing Competition, and the Regional Young Organists Competition (sponsored by the Toronto Centre of the RCCO). He was also one of two prizewinners at the 2008 Fort Wayne

National Organ Playing Competition in Indiana. Ryan is currently Associate Organist and Music Administrator at Christ Church United Methodist on Park Avenue in New York City.
